## New Sanctuary Movement of Atlanta – Metro North

The Unitarian Universalist Service Committee (UUSC) is the social justice organization of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA). The UUSC has contracted with the New Sanctuary Movement of Atlanta, an Immigrant and Refugee Justice organization based in Decatur, to create a "Metro North" chapter of this organization. This will consist of the North Fulton and Cobb interfaith community as well as local organizations on the ground pursuing Immigration and Refugee Justice in our community. Back in 2017, frustrated by always having to go to the congregation every time something broke down Bob Popp, and the Board of Trustees voted to created the infrastructure depreciation fund. The goal of the fund, guided by Don Grose's wisdom, was to have a reserve to use for those replacements all homeowners have to face: painting, roof replacements, HVAC systems, water heaters, plumbing. A small percentage of the operating income (3%) was set aside each month to fund this account.

After a year of saving, we had managed to set aside eight thousand dollars. Which was a good thing since this June we had a compressor go out on one of the six air conditioning systems we maintain to cool the property. Five thousand dollars quickly disappeared from the fund. Alas, the air handling system has now gone out on yet another HVAC unit. Twenty-five hundred dollars is the cost quoted for this new replacement. As you can see, our little nest egg is rapidly disappearing. And since the HVAC units are all about the same age, we are predicting even more replacements.

So, even though our hope was to avoid coming to you with our hat in our hand, I'm afraid we once more must ask for your help to build the fund back up to handle these replacements. If you can afford to contribute, please think about adding an extra check to the basket next Sunday marked depreciation fund to help us build up our little replacement nest egg again.

In 2013 UUMAN led by Kate Hudson and others UUMAN applied for and received Green Sanctuary Accreditation from the UUA. It was a lengthy process to obtain the accreditation, and a lot of hard work on the part of the "Green Team" and the entire congregation. In addition to the accreditation the UUMAN Board also approved the UUMAN Sustainability Policy about the same time.

We owe it to ourselves and future generations of UUMAN members to become knowledgeable about the Green Sanctuary Accreditation and to do what we can to make sure that we continue to follow the UUMAN Sustainability Policy (https://www.uuman.org/pdf/UUMANSustainabilityPolicy.pdf).

The policy states that UUMAN will "As an accredited Green Sanctuary, Our UUMAN community is committed to lowering its impact on the environment and reducing its carbon footprint through wise energy usage and purchasing policies". It then goes on to layout sustainability goals for UUMAN some of which we have achieved or are working on. Others we have yet to achieve.
