Last Sunday after service we were thrilled to have more than 20 people show up to discuss how UUMAN can get involved in the next elections and the political process as a whole.

We decided on an initiative that we will be working on during the Fall. We are going to be writing letters to GA voters who have not been regular voters encouraging them to show up in November.

In a recent service I talked about UUA goals to become a "Good Trouble Congregation". One of the goals is sending 20 letters per member.

On **August 7**, UUMAN will be hosting the first LETTER WRITING PARTY right after the service (more details to follow).

UUtheVote is working with many partners on this initiative and we have chosen to support VOTE FORWARD. They have a GA list and that is the one we will be working on.

If you would like to join us this is what you need to do in order to download your 20 letters and join us on **August 7**: 1. Go to https://votefwd.org/uu and sign up. You should receive a confirmation email.

2. Follow instructions on the confirmation email to register.

3. After you register you will receive another email stating that you are approved for letter writing.

4. Log in and choose GA campaign, commit to 20 letters, download and print them with you on August 7.

"I WANT TO WRITE LETTERS BUT I CANNOT COME ON AUGUST 7". No problem, send them out following the instructions on the website and let me know so your letters can count towards our overall goal.

Let me know if you have questions.

We will meet grievance and hate with love, beloved community and fun!
