Minister's Sabbatical

As you may have heard, I plan on taking a sabbatical from February through May of 2024. UU ministers are entitled to sabbaticals after four

years of service and are entitled to one month of sabbatical for each year of service. At the end of this church year, I will have completed seven years as UUMAN's minister.

A sabbatical leave offers an extended time for study, reflection, rest, and renewal—all ingredients for effective ministry. A sabbatical leave is part of the congregation's covenant agreement with the minister; and just as importantly, the congregation will benefit as I returns refreshed, filled with new ideas and with rekindled energy.

Amanda Bralley and I will serve as Co-Chairs of a newly formed Sabbatical Committee – which is a temporary Standing Committee, reporting to the Board of Trustees, that plans and prepares the congregation for a ministerial sabbatical. The committee consists of the two Co-Chairs and four other members of the congregation. Amanda will serve as the sole chair once I actually begin the sabbatical.

The Sabbatical Committee is charged with the following:

- Help schedule Sunday Service guest speakers three times per month
- Schedule "On Call" minister for Pastoral Care and any Rites of Passage rituals that may be necessary
- Communicate with the congregation before, during and after the sabbatical

- Assist Board of Trustees regarding any issues pertaining to staff supervision
- Assist the minister and congregation in the development of a re-entry and re-engagement program following the sabbatical

The other members of the sabbatical Committee are David Kroeber, Anu Mongia, Tina Alexander and Bruce Langston. Since the production of quality worship services in my absence will be a principal activity for the committee, I feel that we have the right people in place since they all either serve on the worship team, serve as worship associates, sing in the choir or serve on our technical/livestreaming crew.

I know that UUMAN has had some history with ministers returning from sabbaticals and then shortly thereafter leaving the congregation. Even though UUMAN's ministerial contract states that the minister must continue at least one full year after any sabbatical, I am not interested in leaving UUMAN. I am finding that the shared ministry we do together to be most fulfilling. Although one of the purposes of the sabbatical is to give me time to generate new ideas and recharge my batteries, I still feel like I have ideas to share and energy with which to pursue them. That said, next spring is probably the right time for me to take this sabbatical.

Nurture our spirit. Strive for Justice. Transform the world.

UUMAN Safety Committee Update

Early this year, when the board looked at the issue of safety at UUMAN, we realized this was an issue that needed more attention and a comprehensive approach. To that end, we formed a Safety Committee, tasked with creating and implementing a safety plan for our campus and congregation.

Partnering with Local Law Enforcement

One of our first steps was to invite the Roswell Police Department to visit UUMAN and conduct their Active Threat training. A large group of us met in Fellowship Hall on Saturday, January 21 to hear an officer speak about responding to an active threat on our grounds. Just recently, on April 26th, we met with a Roswell police officer to conduct a walkthrough and security assessment of our campus, to help us identify vulnerabilities and opportunities for improving security. We're fortunate to have excellent police and fire departments in Roswell, who serve as willing and able allies.

Partnering with Our Insurance

We discovered that our insurance company, Church Mutual, offers low-cost police alarms that use the same monitoring service we use for our water and temperature monitors. So we purchased two for our campus. These alarms work much like a fire alarm—you can pull them and the monitoring service alerts the police of a situation at UUMAN. While we have long had fire alarms onsite, this plugs a gap for us in police alarms.

Here are some other new initiatives we have begun:

- Held a fire drill for youth RE classes on 4-23
- Began locking and monitoring doors after service starts
- Met with Premo school to share ideas and concerns regarding safety
- Wrote a charter and policy for the Safety Committee
- Began collaborating on a detailed safety plan for UUMAN
- Began creating a team of Safety Guides to monitor doors and parking lots

Partnering with Each Other

We now post a Safety Guide at our doors to monitor the parking lot and entry doors during service. You can help by being vigilant and reporting any suspicious behavior you see in the parking lot or on campus. If you would like to volunteer to be a Safety Guide, contact;
